In the summer of 2000, the Bardini Foundation received an unsolicited grant of \$250 from the **Dale and Edna Walsh Foundation** (DEW Foundation) located in Incline Village, Nevada. We were brought to the DEW's attention by Walter Edberg who knew Allan Bard and had great respect for his talents and goals.

Over the past three years the DEW Foundation has approved over \$15,000 in grants to the Bardini Foundation. The major portion of this money was set aside to finance **liability insurance premiums** being sought by Bardini for coverage of our 2004 outdoor activities. Smaller amounts have been used to upgrade our desktop **publishing equipment** and have allowed us to sponsor each year's five-day Level-III **avalanche courses**.

In sympathy with the impending loss, the Bardini House front yard apple tree also gave it up - to the axe. Like the house, the tree would inevitably have to go. The tree, shown above in its springtime glory, had been on its last legs for many years and appropriately came down about the time we received notice of the eventual loss. The sign over the front door and all the memorabilia in the house will be stored locally. There will be no more apple pies and no more Monday nights at Bardini's.

Four Pass Level-III Avalanche Course

On February 6-10, the Bardini Avalanche Education Center sponsored its fourth annual Level-III Avalanche Training Course this winter. The Bardini course is nationally unique in that it is offered on a pass-fail basis.

Five days were spent in the Mammoth Lakes and June Mountain ski areas with four aspirants attending to the classroom and field requirements of the course. The instructors were Don Sharaf and Tim Villanueva.

On February 10, certificates were awarded to **Rich Rinaldi, Ann Mellick, Toby Wheeler, and Nate Greenberg** for their participation.

The Foundation sincerely appreciates the cooperation of the **Mammoth Community Water District, the June Mountain Ski Area** and their ski patrol for allowing access and the use of their facilities.

In accordance with our stated purpose - that of providing funds to train aspiring guides - a portion of the course cost for ski guide Rich Rinaldi was assumed by the foundation.

Avalanche Education Winter Report

In addition to the Level-III course featured on page-1, the foundation continued to provide local beacon clinics hosted by Mammoth Mountaineering Supply.

Two **Level-I courses** were offered in the Mammoth area with the cooperation of the Snow Creek Athletic Club. Many people took advantage of these reasonably priced courses. **Financial assistance** was provided for the Mono and Inyo County Search and Rescue (SAR) team members and aspiring guide Tobin Nidever.

Tim Villanueva, Bardini's chief guide, continues to volunteer his time and expertise in community related activities. Two days in December were spent with the **Inyo and Mono County SAR teams** in basic avalanche training.

Again this year, Tim offered a snow and environmental awareness outing for the **Bishop Paiute Tribal Youth Sports Program**.

Villanueva continues to volunteer doing the only **Eastern Sierra avalanche forecast**. This forecast is posted weekly on the Mountain page of the **Inyo Register** - the local Bishop newspaper - and on the Internet at www.csac.org. This is not an easy task for one person. We are seeking funds to expand the personnel involved and relieve some of Tim's workload. Any donations supporting this endeavor should be sent to the address below.

Bardini To Host First Level-III Avalanche Symposium

At a date to be announced later this year, the Bardini Avalanche Education Center will host a Level-III avalanche symposium course in the winter of 2004-2005.

In our effort to remain at the cutting edge of professional development in avalanche training, the Center is inviting the top AAA and AAIRE instructors in the United States to attend this first-ever course symposium.

The Level-III course will be conducted at the Tioga Pass Resort and in the surrounding Sierra environs.

Participants will gain the unique perspective of the four individual instructors - each of whom is an experienced avalanche professional and ski guide. Students will observe guiding techniques and decision-making processes in the field with these instructors.

Each student is expected to have completed a Level-II course within the last 5 years. Successful course completion requires that each student pass a written test and specific field evaluations. There will be a very **limited student-to-instructor ratio**. Contact us early if you want to be part of this great professional development course.

A Letter To Allan From Millis

July 9th 2003
